The remaining eight hundred fifty (850) hours are to be devoted to supervised practice integrated with ongoing theoretical and practical instruction.

Instructors shall be at least 18 years of age, hold a high school diploma or equivalent, hold a current license as a barber in good standing in Connecticut, and have at least 2 years of licensed work experience (e.g., barber shop, salon, instructor, etc.).

Students in SAP/FA Suspension are considered ineligible for VA Educational Assistance benefits and as such the School VA Certifying Official will no longer be permitted to certify the student's enrollment for any training towards the remaining requirement of his/her program which he/she completes before being readmitted to the approved program. VA students may avail themselves of the school's appeals process.

Evaluation Periods:

Students are evaluated for 2024 Satisfactory Academic Progress as follows:

Cosmetology: 450, (13 weeks), 900 (26 weeks), 1200 (38 weeks), (actual) hours
Barbering: 450 (13 weeks), 900 (26 weeks), (actual) hours
Esthetics: 300, (12 weeks), 600, (24 weeks), (actual) hours

*Transfer students- Midpoint of the contracted hours or the established evaluation periods, whichever comes first.

Evaluations will determine if the student has met the minimum requirements for satisfactory academic progress. The frequency of evaluations ensures that students have ample opportunity to meet both the attendance and academic progress requirements of at least one evaluation by midpoint in the program.

Attendance Progress Evaluations:

Students are required to attend a minimum of 67% of the hours possible based on the applicable attendance schedule in order to be considered maintaining satisfactory attendance progress. Evaluations are conducted at the end of each evaluation period to determine if the student has met the minimum requirements. The attendance percentage is determined by dividing the total hours accrued by the total number of hours scheduled. At the end of each evaluation period, TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown will determine if the student has maintained at least 67% cumulative attendance since the beginning of the course which indicates that, given the same attendance rate, the student will graduate within the maximum time frame allowed.

Maximum Time Frame:

The maximum time which does not exceed 150% of the course length allowed for students to complete each program at satisfactory academic progress is stated below:

The maximum time allowed for transfers students who need less than the full course requirements or part-time students will be determined based on 67% of scheduled hours. Students who exceed the maximum time frame will be automatically terminated.

Academic Progress Evaluations:

The qualitative element used to determine academic progress is a reasonable system of grades as determined by assigned academic learning. Students are assigned academic learning and minimum number of practical experiences. Academic learning is evaluated after each unit of study. Practical assignments are evaluated as completed and counted toward course completion only when rated as satisfactory or better. If the performance does not meet satisfactory requirements, it is not counted and the performance must be repeated. At least two comprehensive practical skills evaluations will be conducted during the course of study. Practical's are evaluated according to text procedures and set forth in practical skills evaluation criteria adopted by the school. Students must maintain a written grade average of 70% and pass a Final written and practical exam prior to graduation. Students must make up failed or missed tests and incomplete assignments. Numerical grades are considered according to the following scale:

Determination of Progress:

Students meeting the minimum requirements for academics (70%) and attendance (67%) at the evaluation point are considered to be making satisfactory academic progress until the next scheduled evaluation. Students will receive a copy of their Satisfactory Academic Progress Determination at the time of each of the evaluations. Students deemed not maintaining Satisfactory Progress may have their Title IV funding (if applicable) interrupted, unless the student is on warning or has prevailed upon appeal resulting in a status of probation.

Academic counseling sessions with students are provided ongoing as needed.

Warning:

Students who fail to meet minimum requirements for attendance or academic progress are placed on warning and considered to be making satisfactory academic progress while during the warning period.

The student will be advised in writing on the actions required to attain satisfactory academic progress by the next evaluation. If at the end of the warning period, the student has still not met both the attendance and academic requirements, he/she may be placed on probation and, if applicable, student may be deemed ineligible to receive Title IV funds.

Probation:

Students who fail to meet minimum requirements for attendance or academic progress after the warning period will be placed on probation and considered to be making satisfactory academic progress while during the probationary period, if the student appeals the decision, and prevails upon appeal. Additionally, only students who have the ability to meet Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy standards by the end of the evaluation period may be placed on probation. Students placed on an academic plan must be able to meet requirements set forth in academic plan by the end of the next evaluation period. Students who are progressing according to their specific academic plan will be considered making satisfactory Academic Progress. The student will be advised in writing of the actions required to attain satisfactory academic progress by the next evaluation. If at the end of the probationary period, the student has still not met both the attendance and academic requirements required for satisfactory academic progress or by the academic plan, he/she will be determined as NOT making satisfactory academic progress and, if applicable, students will not be deemed eligible to receive Title IV funds.

Re-Establishment of Satisfactory Academic Progress:

Students may re-establish satisfactory academic progress and Title IV aid, as applicable, by meeting minimum attendance and academic requirements by the end of the probationary period. Students who reenter will reenter under the same satisfactory academic progress status as in place at the time the individual left if they were determined to be on probation, then they will reenter on probation. Additionally, when using probation, it must last until the next scheduled evaluation point

Interruptions, Course Incompletes, Withdrawals:

Effective 11/15/16, the leave of absence policy is rescinded. If a student needs to be absent for an extended period, they will be required to withdraw from the program.

Students who withdraw prior to completion of the course and wish to re-enroll will return in the same satisfactory academic progress status as at the time of withdrawal.

Students who withdraw from the program are required to gather all personal items. Any items left behind by the **student will be stored for 60 days, at which time the items become the property of TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown**

Students wishing to withdraw must notify the school. If a student does not notify the school, they will be withdrawn after 14 consecutive calendar days of absence. Upon a student's withdrawal, a refund calculation for any and all Title IV funds will be conducted in accordance with Department of Education Regulations. Additionally, a withdrawal settlement calculation will be completed to determine what monies are owed to the school per the enrollment agreement terms. A student will receive notice of withdrawal via email, as well as a copy sent to their mailing address on file.

Students wishing to withdraw and transfer to another institution must attend an exit interview and pay all monies owed the school or made satisfactory arrangements for debts as approved by TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown. An Official Transcript of Hours will be issued to students who withdraw prior to program completion when the student has successfully completed all the above requirements.

Appeal Procedure:

If a student is determined to not be making satisfactory academic progress, the student may appeal the determination within 10 calendar days. Reasons for which students may appeal a negative progress determination include death of a relative, an injury or illness of the student, or any other allowable special or mitigating circumstance. The student must submit a written appeal to TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown on the designated form with supporting documentation of the reasons why the determination should be reversed. This information should include what has changed about the

student's situation that will allow them to achieve Satisfactory Academic Progress by the next evaluation point. Appeal documents will be reviewed and a decision will be made and reported to the student within 30 calendar days. The appeal and decision documents will be retained in the student file. If the student prevails upon appeal the satisfactory academic progress determination will be reversed and federal financial aid will be reinstated, if applicable.

Incompletes, Repetitions, Noncredit and Remedial Courses:

Incompletes, Repetitions, non-credit and remedial courses do not apply to TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown. Therefore, these items have no effect upon the school's satisfactory academic progress standards.

Transfer hours:

With regard to Satisfactory Academic Progress, a student's transfer hours will be counted as both attempted and earned hours for the purpose of determining when the allowable maximum time frame has been exhausted.

Graduation Requirements

In order to graduate you must meet the following requirements:

1. Satisfy all state requirements, consisting of:

a. Completion of required state hours

b .Completion of exams and course requirements

- 2. Fulfill practical operations required by the Academy and the state.**
- 3. Comply with all policies in the school catalog.**
- 4. Maintain a 70% or higher grade point average.**
- 5. Complete the program while maintaining Satisfactory Academic progress.**
- 6. Make arrangements to pay all tuitions, fees and overtime charges (if applicable) before graduation day.**
- 7. Complete Graduate Survey.**
- 8. Turn in all keys and academy property. You will be charged a fee for each key that is not returned. This charge must be paid prior to receiving your diploma.**

Upon your satisfaction of the above criteria, you will be recognized as a graduate of TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown. For Cosmetology, and Barbering, we will issue a diploma to you. For Esthetics, we will issue a certificate of completion to you.

***Verification of hours will not be notarized for the ST or CT license application until all financial obligations are met (this includes full tuition, overtime and any miscellaneous expenses)**

The fees for both testing and licensing are the responsibility of the student to pay.

Employment Assistance/ Career Counseling Policy

While TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown cannot guarantee employment for its graduates, assistance in finding suitable employment is provided by posting job openings on the career opportunities bulletin board. Students also receive training in Resume development, Professionalism and Job interview skills. TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown maintains a relationship with professionals and potential employers of TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown graduates. Job referrals are made known to interested graduates as available. Student counseling regarding day to day academics, attendance and TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown rules compliance is ongoing and as needed. If professional counseling is needed, students are referred to the list of professionals located on the back of the bathroom doors.

Absence Policy

Students are allowed excused absences for medical emergency, bereavement and other unusual circumstances that may be approved by TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown. Written documentation is required and must be approved by the school director. Students who will be absent are required to notify the school as soon as possible. Any other absences will be considered unexcused and may result in overtime charges.

Tardiness Policy

Students are expected to be in school by 8:30AM. Students clocking in after 8:35AM are subject to the Academy's tardiness policy. Conduct

Students must conduct themselves professionally at all times or risk temporary or permanent dismissal

Dress Code

Termination / Dismissal

Students may be terminated for non-compliance with their contract, State Laws and Regulations, General policies, rules and regulations of the school, Improper conduct or any action which causes or could cause bodily harm to a client, a student, or employee of TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown; willful destruction of school property, theft, drug / alcohol use or any illegal act, Failure to meet required Satisfactory Academic Progress, or non-payment of tuition per agreement. If a student has been terminated, they must wait 30 days or more before reapplying for reinstatement. This will be decided at the discretion of the Director, according to the circumstances for dismissal, withdrawal or termination.

Policy Changes

TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown reserves the right to make changes to scheduling, course format, academic calendar, programs, and staff. Any changes made will not affect the integrity of programs. Students will be notified, if possible, of any changes prior to the changes being made.

Family Education Rights and Privacy Act

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a Federal law that protects the privacy of student education records.

- FERPA gives rights to students and parents or guardians of dependent minors with respect to student education records.
- Eligible students or Parents/ guardians have the right to inspect and review the student's education records maintained by TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown is not required to provide copies of records unless, for reasons such as great distance, it is impossible for eligible students or parents/ guardians to review the records.
- TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown may charge a fee for copies.
Eligible students or parents/guardians have the right to request that TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown correct records which they believe to be inaccurate or misleading. If the
- TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown decides not to amend the record, the eligible student or parents/guardians then has the right to a formal hearing. Student Grievance Procedure

In accordance with TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown mission statement, TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown will make every attempt to resolve any student complaint that is not frivolous or without merit. Complaint procedures will be included in new student orientation thereby assuring that all students know the steps to follow should they desire to register a complaint at any time.

Evidence of final resolution of all complaints will be retained in TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown files in order to determine the frequency, nature, and patterns of complaints for the institution. The following procedure outlines the specific steps of the complaint process.

1. The student should register the complaint in writing on the designated form provided by TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown within 30 days of the date that the act which is the subject of the grievance occurred.
2. The complaint form will be given to the TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown Director.
3. The complaint will be reviewed by management and a response will be sent in writing to the student within 30 days of receiving the complaint. The initial response may not provide for final resolution of the problem but will notify the student of continued investigation and/or actions being taken regarding the complaint.
4. If the complaint is of such nature that it cannot be resolved by the management, it will be referred to an appropriate agency if applicable.
5. Depending on the extent and nature of the complaint, interviews with appropriate staff and other students may be necessary to reach a final resolution of the complaint.
6. In cases of extreme conflict, it may be necessary to conduct an informal hearing regarding the complaint. If necessary, management will appoint a hearing committee consisting of one member selected by TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown who has had no involvement in the dispute and who may also be a corporate officer, another member who may not be related to the student filing the complaint or another student in TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown and another member who may not be employed by TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown or related to TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown owners. The hearing will occur within 90 days of committee appointment. The hearing will be informal with the student presenting his/her case followed by TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown response. The hearing committee will be allowed to ask questions of all involved parties. Within 15 days of the hearing, the committee will prepare a report summarizing each witness' testimony and a recommended resolution for the dispute. TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown management shall consider the report and either accept, reject, or modify the recommendations of the committee. Corporate management shall consider the report and either accept, reject, or modify the recommendations of the committee.

Financial Aid recipients understand that monies received on their behalf are applied first to tuition costs. Refund Policy – Notice of Cancellation

This refund policy will apply to all terminations for any reason, by either party, including student decision, expulsion, course or program cancellation, non-payment of tuition per agreement, or TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown closure.

- When calculating refunds, TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown will use the policy mandated by the State and /or federal regulatory agencies or special programs for each student, as applicable.
 - For all applicants who cancel enrollment or students who withdraw from enrollment a fair and equitable settlement will apply.
 - Applicants not accepted by TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown shall be refunded all monies paid to the school except the NON-REFUNDABLE application fee of \$100.00.
 - If student (or in the case of student under legal age, his/her parent or guardian) cancels the enrollment in writing within three business days of signing the enrollment agreement, all monies collected by TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown will be refunded except the NON-REFUNDABLE application fee of \$100.00, even if the student has begun classes.
 - If a student cancels the enrollment after three business days of signing the contract but prior to starting classes, a refund of all monies paid to the school less the NON-REFUNDABLE application fee in the amount of \$100 will be made.
 - The "official cancellation / withdrawal date" will be determined by:

 - h) A student or legal guardian cancels the enrollment agreement within three business days
 - i) A student cancels the contract within three business days
 - j) A student notifies the school of their withdrawal
 - Unofficial withdrawal for clock hour students is determined by TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown through monitoring clock hour attendance at least every thirty (30) days.
 - Actual refunds are calculated based on the student's last verifiable date of attendance. Timeliness of refunds is determined using the student's withdrawal or termination date. The date of withdrawal determination for students on leave of absence shall be the earlier of the scheduled date of return from the leave of absence or the date the student notifies the institution that the student will not be returning.
 - Any money due the applicant or student shall be refunded within 45 days of the formal cancellation/ withdrawal date of determination. This applies to official, and unofficial withdrawals.
 - For students who enroll and begin classes but withdraw prior to course completion (after three business days of signing the contract), the following schedule of tuition earned by the school applies. If TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown cancels a course and/or program and ceases to offer instructions after students have enrolled and instruction has begun, TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown shall at its option; Provide a pro-rat refund to all students transferring to another school based on the hours accepted by the receiving school.
- For non-transferring students,
Ricci's Toni&Guy Hairdressing Academy/TIGI Creative School shall at its option provide completion of the course and/or program, or provide a refund of all monies paid.

Refunds are calculated on scheduled hours.

- In the case of disabling illness or injury, death in the student's immediate family or other documented mitigating circumstances, a reasonable and fair refund settlement will be made.
 - If permanently closed or no longer offering instruction after a student has enrolled, and instruction has begun, TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown will provide a pro rata refund of tuition to the student. A list of all students who were enrolled at the time of TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown closure, including the amount of each pro- rata refund, will be submitted to the accrediting agency.
 - If the course is canceled subsequent to a student's enrollment, and before instruction in the course has begun, the school will either provide a full refund of all monies paid or completion of the course at a later time. If the course is cancelled by the school and ceases to offer instruction after students have enrolled, and instruction has begun, the school shall at it's option; provide a pro-rata refund for all students transferring to another school, or provide completion of the course and/or program, or provide a full refund of all monies paid.
 - TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown does not participate in any teach-out plans with other institutions. Students who withdraw or terminate prior to course completion are charged a cancellation or termination fee of \$100.00.
 - This refund policy applies to tuition and fees charged in the enrollment agreement. See below.
 - (1500-hour program: \$19,000 tuition, non-refundable \$100 application fee, \$200 enrollment fee, \$3,200 student kit)
 - (1000-hour program: \$14,000 tuition, non-refundable \$100 application fee, \$200 enrollment fee, \$3,200 student kit)
 - (600-hour program: \$8,750 tuition, non-refundable \$100 application fee, \$200 enrollment fee, \$1,500 student kit)
 - Other miscellaneous charges the student may have incurred at TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown (EG: extra kit materials, books, products, unreturned school property, etc.) are not included in the tuition price, are non- refundable, and will be calculated separately at the time of withdrawal. All fees are identified in the catalog and in this enrollment agreement.
 - If a student withdraws prior to course completion, a calculation for return of funds will be completed and any applicable returns by TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown shall be paid, as applicable.
- After all applicable returns have been made, this refund policy will apply to determine the amount earned by TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown and owed by the student.
- If the student has received personal payments of aid, he/she may be required to refund the aid to the applicable program.
 - If a Title IV financial aid recipient withdraws prior to course completion, a calculation for return of TIV funds will be completed and any applicable returns by TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown shall be paid, as applicable, first to unsubsidized Federal Stafford Student Loan Program; second to subsidized Federal Stafford Student Loan Program; third to Federal Pell grant Program; fourth to other Federal, State, private or institutional student financial assistance programs; and last to the student.
- After all applicable returns to TIV aid have been made, this refund policy will apply to determine the amount earned by TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown and owed by the student.
- If the student has received personal payments of Title IV aid, he/she may be required to refund the aid to the applicable program.

Cost over Contract

Each student will be given an additional 77 scheduled hours to complete the required clock hours of instruction for their chosen field if the student fails to complete the program in the time allowed as contracted, and applicable. Any student going past the applicable program scheduled hours: Cosmetology program (1500 scheduled hours) / barbering program (1000 scheduled hours) will be required to pay **\$11.00 (Cosmetology). \$11.00 (Barbering)** for each additional hour necessary to reach the programs required actual hours of attendance.

TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown Scholarship

TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown does not have currently have a scholarship program.

VA Student Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy

The VA is not accepting any Standards of Academic Progress policy that does not have a definitive termination when VA students are not in compliance with the policy.

Veteran students using GI Bill® educational benefits must adhere to the school's Standards of Academic Progress (SAP) to remain eligible to receive VA payments. If a VA student is not meeting the requirements of the SAP at an evaluation period, the VA student will be placed on academic probation for the subsequent evaluation period. If the VA student does not meet the requirements of the SAP at the next evaluation period, the student will be suspended from using their VA educational benefits until satisfactory standards of progress have been achieved.

The school may allow a VA student to continue while their VA benefits have been suspended, but they will not be certified for VA benefits for that enrollment period. A VA student cannot be certified to use their VA benefits during an appeal, but if successful in their appeal, they can be certified retro-actively for that enrollment period to the VA.

2. 90 days after the date, TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown, certified tuition and fees following the receipt of the certificate of eligibility

TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown will not impose any penalty, including the assessment of late fees, the denial of access to classes, libraries, or other institutional facilities, or the requirement that a covered individual borrow additional funds, on any covered individual because of the individual's inability to meet his or her financial obligations to TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown due to the delayed disbursement funding from VA under chapter 31 or 33.



Initial Steps to Obtaining Financial Aid

Welcome to TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown. Our Academy is a great way to begin your professional hairdressing career. Many students worry about how to pay for their hairdressing education and ask us about their options. Often our students choose to investigate financial aid opportunities including grants, loans, and scholarships.

There are basically five steps to receiving financial aid. In most cases, you can complete all five steps in less than an hour. Here are the steps;

1. Complete a **Free Application for Federal Student Aid**, also known as a **FAFSA**. The **current application(s) you will need to fill out are the 23-24 and 24-25 FAFSA**.
2. You can find this application, at no cost, at **www.studentaid.gov**.
 - If you are under the age of 24, you are not married, you have no children, and are not a veteran, you're considered a **Dependent Student**. This means you need to have your tax return information available when you go online to complete your FAFSA, and you will also need to have your parent's tax information.
 - If you do not meet the requirements of being a Dependent Student, you may fall under the category of **Independent**, and only need to have *your* tax return information available.
 - Double check your entries to make sure everything you input is accurate. The Department of Education does not take applications with incomplete or inaccurate information.
 - **THE EASIEST WAY** to make sure you've filled out your tax information correctly is to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool. There is a link and instructions on how to use it right on the FAFSA site when you arrive at the appropriate section. This makes the entire process as smooth and easy as possible.
 - Make sure **you and your parents** (for dependent students) sign the application according to the electronic instructions.
 - Enter "**Save**" and "**Submit.**" Entering "**Submit**" allows us to receive your application.

- Make sure you put our school code # **042309** where requested. Once you enter our code, we will receive a copy of your application.
- 3. After you complete your FAFSA, you will need to go through the Entrance Counseling process. Complete this online at the same website, www.studentaid.gov
- 4. Click on “Complete Aid Process” and then from there click “Complete Entrancing Counselling” from the options. During this process, you will learn how loans work, how your interest is calculated, and the terms for repaying your loan. You will select our school from a list to notify.
- 5. You will also need to complete a “Master Promissory Note.” This is your agreement to pay back whatever you borrow through the Federal Student Loan system. This can also be completed in the “Complete Aid Process” section. Make sure to complete the promissory note for “Subsidized/Unsubsidized Loans.” You will select our school from a list to notify.

Finally, be proactive and search out scholarships. You can visit www.fastweb.com to help you in your search. The application might seem a bit long, but once you get through it, you can access a wonderful resource of all types of scholarships. Remember scholarships and grants are “free money” meaning you do not have to pay them back. Don't stop your search for scholarships there, though ---ask your church organizers, your hair stylist, anyone you can think of that might know about a scholarship opportunity.

We will be in touch with you once your school start date has been established. We want you to feel very comfortable with your Financial Aid choices and with the process, even though it can seem daunting at times. We are here to help guide you through the process, so whether you have general questions or need help with your FASFA, please contact our Financial Aid coordinator. Important Facts about TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown Programs

TIGI Hairdressing Academy Newtown offers programs in Cosmetology and Barbering. All programs are taught in English.

Licensing requirements

Cosmetology is a clock hour program which prepares the student for Licensing. The State of Ct requires a student to have completed the eighth grade, the required hours of instruction from a CT state approved curriculum and passed the CT State Board Written Exam with a minimum score of 70% in order to obtain a Cosmetology/Barber license.

Cosmetology requires 1500 clock hours.

Barbering requires 1000 clock hours

Programs are offered in a Day schedule (full or part-time)

State Licensing Disclaimer

The state may refuse to grant a license if a student has been convicted of a crime; committed an act involving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit; or committed any act that, if committed by a licensee of the business or profession in question, would be grounds for the Department of Health to deny licensure. The Department of Health denies licensure on the grounds that the applicant made a false statement of fact required to be revealed in the application for such license.

TIGI Hairdressing Academy is not responsible for students denied licensure. Students who are not US citizens or who do not have documented authority to work in the United States will not be eligible to apply to take the state licensure examination. TIGI Hairdressing Academy is not responsible for students denied licensure.

Industry Requirements

According to CT Job & Career Connection employment in this occupation is expected to grow faster than average, and the number of annual openings will offer excellent opportunities.

The results of the latest Job Demand Survey (2007) conducted by NACCAS states that "82% of Connecticut Salon Owners who attempted to hire new employees were unable to find properly trained applicants". This means that "jobs would be immediately available for salon professionals and that salons in Connecticut plan to hire 7,174 new employees in the next twelve months." The average salary was \$36,630.00 not including tips or benefits.

Prospective cosmetologists must be aware of the **physical demands in this career** as they can be strenuous:

Hygiene: It is important for cosmetologists to have adequate hygiene for several reasons. The first is simply a matter of self-recommendation. It is a cosmetologist's job to help others look as attractive as possible; therefore, it is important for the cosmetologist to have a neat, clean appearance. Most people would not want to go into a salon and have someone do their hair or make-up who clearly doesn't take care of her own hair and make-up. Cosmetologists' physical appearances are walking references to their skill ability.

In terms of cleanliness, refined personal hygiene is crucial for cosmetologists. Cosmetologists regularly touch their clients, more so than many other professions, so they need to keep clean as a matter of course or may spread dirt, germs, disease and possibly bugs, such as lice amongst clients.

Body Positioning: Cosmetologists are required to stand about 75 percent of the time. Cosmetologists must lean forward, stoop, bend and twist. Standing and leaning over clients is a common position when washing a client's hair or administering a facial. The back experiences significant stress during the course of a cosmetologist's day. If an individual cannot stand or remain standing for long periods of time, they are unlikely to be successful as cosmetologists because they will not be able to perform tasks accurately.

Steady Hands: A cosmetologist's hands are frequently exposed to water and cleansing. Cosmetologists work with their hands to cut hair, perform manicures and pedicures, make-up and other applications. To perform all these tasks successfully, the cosmetologist must have the ability to control her hands and fingers at all times, including holding the hand very steady while cutting hair, applying makeup or other beauty treatments. A cosmetologist who cannot hold her hands steady is certain to receive a number of complaints from incorrectly or badly performed procedures.

Allergies: Cosmetologists are required to handle a large number of chemicals and use a variety of cleansing agents. If an individual is highly allergic to any of these products or very sensitive to these sorts of items, they are unlikely to succeed in cosmetology due to their adverse physical reactions to the tools of the trade.

Using Tools: Cosmetology tools can cause cuts and other injuries, so it's important that a cosmetologist have reasonably good vision so she can handle the tools safely. Dexterity to grasp scissors, razors and small make-up tools is important.
